We will meet you at Casablanca airport. Here, you will take possession of the car you’ve requested. Inside, you will find some *On the Road Experiences* ‘goodies’ that will make your journey and the time on the road even more enjoyable... prepare for a surprise!

Once you have familiarized yourself with the car that will be yours for the next 14 days, you will head north towards the Atlantic coast. You will first sense that you have arrived in Morocco when you see bilingual road signs in Arabic and French, and pass communities of low-rise white-washed Moroccan houses with flat roofs.

The easy drive north will take you to the coastal village of Assilah. Assilah is a quaint, small fishing village with a long

history that has transformed itself into an important cultural and artistic hub. Assilah is particularly well-known for the quality of its seafood, and it is here that we will stop for lunch. After your meal, a stroll in the laidback medina is an option.

The afternoon’s drive will take you through northern landscapes of Morocco with occasional views of the Mediterranean Sea reminding you how close you are to Europe.

You can expect to arrive at your hotel in the late afternoon. Our selected hotel offers spacious rooms, full of Moroccan elegance. A delicious Moroccan dinner will await you in the hotel dining room to celebrate your first day on the road.

## Extension Day 2 Experience art and culture in the artisan town of Tetouan

After breakfast, you will drive south to the nearby city of Tetouan.

Tetouan's medina is a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Take a slow stroll through the old medina, and discover artisans' workshops producing beautiful, genuine crafts that are not easily found elsewhere. The narrow streets are full of life, and offer a tantalising first glimpse of everyday Moroccan life.

Then, you will visit the School of Arts and Trades. Here you see the craftsmen of the future learning to craft wood, embroidery, silk and tiles with typical Tetouan techniques.

Complete your time in Tetouan with a local lunch in a restaurant that was an Arab palace and Grand Viziers' residence in its former incarnations.

You will return to your Tamouda Bay hotel after lunch. There is the option to stop en route at M'Diq to taste freshly-caught sardines.

Spend the rest of the day at leisure, until it's time for sunset drinks and dinner by the Mediterranean Sea.

Today is your chance to explore the Rif, a region well known for its cultural and scenic diversity. Geographically, the Rif Mountains that surround the "Blue City" of Chefchaouen are where Africa and Europe meet. Chefchaouen is also known as the "Jewel of the Rif".

Your route will take you south along the Mediterranean coastline and then inland, meandering through fertile

farmland to the beautiful blue-painted town of Chefchaouen, nestled within the Rif Mountains.

You will have time to wander around this lovely town. Lunch will be arranged in a friendly, small restaurant owned by a lively chef and his family.

After lunch, you will continue south to Fes where you will stay for the next three nights.

Today is also Day 1 of the main itinerary. Upon arrival in Fes you will meet your fellow travellers who will be arriving directly from Casablanca airport.

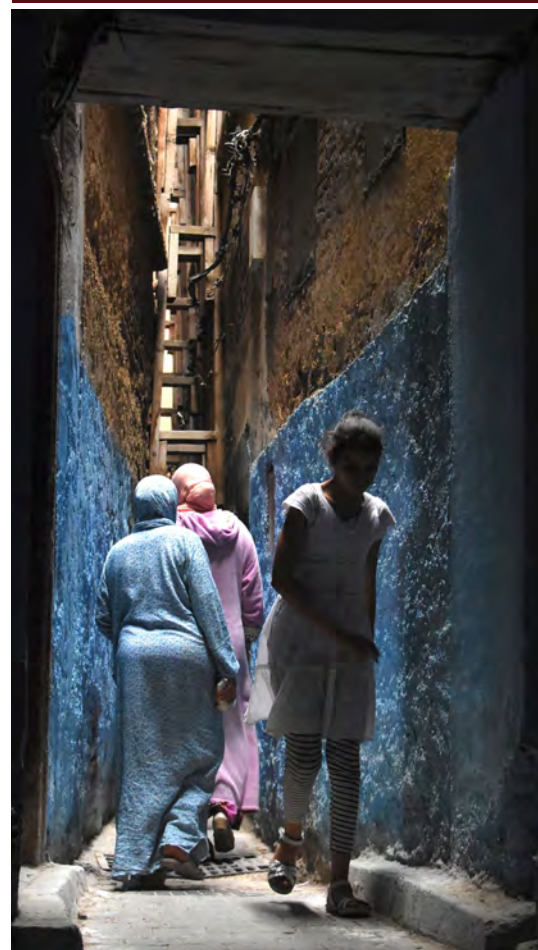

This morning will be your introduction to the many smells, flavours and textures that make up Moroccan cuisine. You will discover the old medina of Fes – the food capital of Morocco – on a tasting trail. Fes's 9th-century Fes el Bali medina is the largest carfree urban area in the world. Some 160,000

people work in 80,000 shops in almost 10,000 alleys dedicated to food and crafts, both traditional and modern.

- Discover the huge range of local spices and produce on sale, including honey, dates and nuts.
- Try traditional Moroccan street food, including milawi, harsha, briwats, spicy sardines, olives and more.
- Visit a few artisan souks and learn about their traditions, time-honoured skills and family stories.

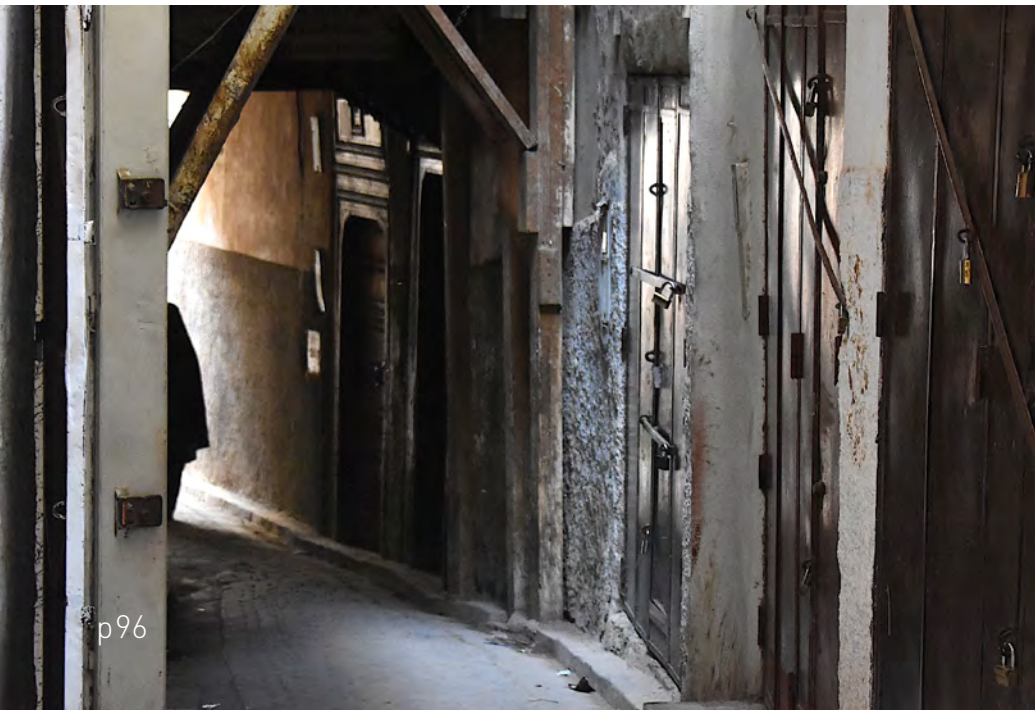

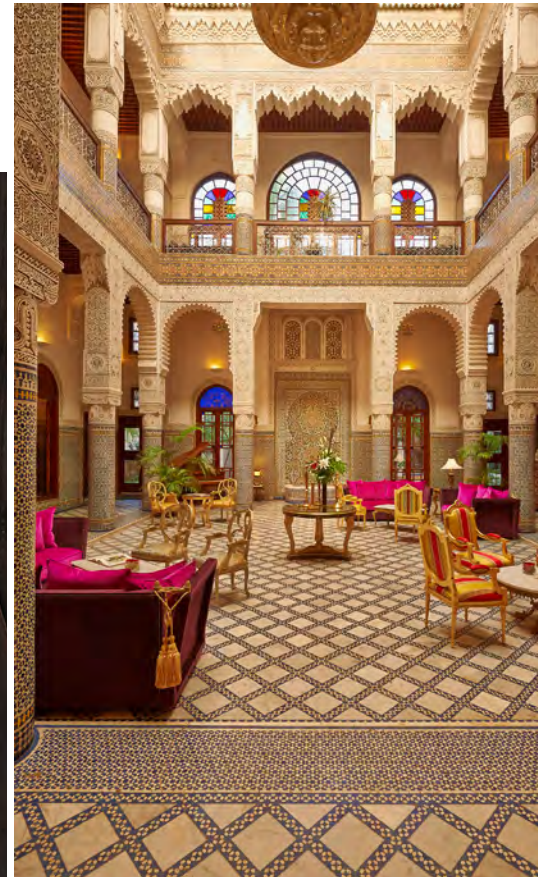

## Day 4

### Volubilis and all things Roman; then enjoy your alpine lodge in the Middle Atlas

This morning, you will go back in time and discover what living in this part of Morocco was like when it was part of the Roman Empire. Volubilis (or Walili in Berber) was the capital of the Roman province of Mauretania, and the southernmost city in the Empire. After exploring the archaeological site, you will enjoy lunch on a shaded farmhouse patio, where we have arranged a spread of foods that were eaten during those long-ago times.

After lunch, you will drive to Ifran. It's hard to imagine a greater contrast between Fes and this spacious, modern town, with its wide tree-lined streets, alpine gardens and chalet-style houses. Also known as Morocco's "little Switzerland", Ifran sits at an altitude of 1650 meters. Surrounded with cedar and oak forests, this is the coldest city in all Africa.

Enjoy an alpine evening in the comfort of a hotel that combines the rustic and the elegant in a most unexpected way – just like Ifran itself!

## Day 5 Drive across nomad 'homeland' and toward the Sahara

Today you will set out for the Sahara. Your route soon leaves the lush alpine landscape behind. Vegetation will become sparser and the landscape flattens as you approach the edge of this immense desert.

You will stop for lunch in a simple family-owned local restaurant in Midelt.

After lunch, you will continue towards Errachidia where you will have an afternoon tea break before driving another hour to your hotel.

Upon arrival at your hotel, if the weather is clear, you have the option to take a 20-minute drive to the Borj East for an amazing view from the top of this boulder that looks over both Erfoud and the surrounding oases. The Tizimi palm grove extends as far as the eye can see along the Ziz and Rheris oueds (river channels). In the distance you

will see the Sahara's first sand dunes, stained pink by the sunset.

## Day 6 A Desert Camp experience - sand dunes, camels and your own luxury tent

Today you will drive on to one of the Sahara's most extraordinary natural wonders, Erg Chebbi.

As you are just 60km from this destination, the first part of the day will be free to enjoy the comforts of your hotel in Erfoud.

Erg Chebbi is one of Morocco's largest Saharan ergs – a sea of dunes formed by windblown sand. Stretching 22km long by 5km wide and reaching 150m high, Erg Chebbi is celebrated for its unique golden-orange that start here and ripple south across Morocco to Timbuktu in Mali.

Tonight, you will sleep under the wide desert sky in a luxury tent. Upon arrival at the desert camp, you will have the option to ride a camel across the dunes at sunset.

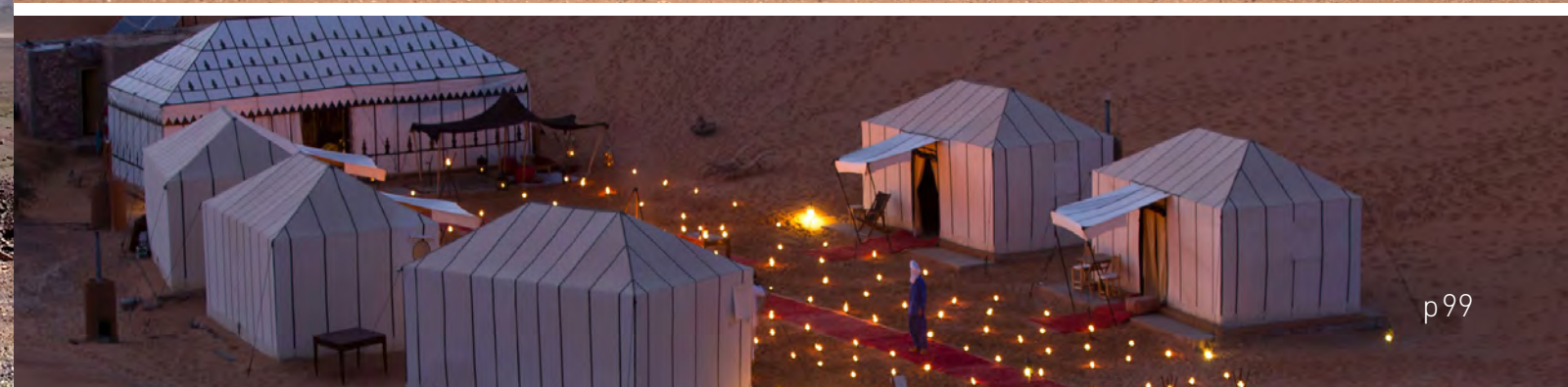

## Day 7

### Stay in the Gorges du Dades and experience the warm hospitality of an amazing home chef & his family

Today's drive, from Erg Chebbi to Tinejdad and on to Gorges du Dades, will be an opportunity to go back in time to the days when nomads were the only people who passed through this rugged country. These caravan tribes arrived loaded with gold at Tinejdad's caravanse-  
rai (Tinejdad means 'nomad'

in Berber), quenched their thirst at natural springs, slept peacefully in well-fortified ksour (forts) in Ferkla oasis and conducted business at the town's medieval commercial centre that once housed an mosque and a sizeable Jewish community. Water, shelter, business and baraka (blessings): what more could a nomad need?

Tonight, your hosts will be a very warm, friendly and hospitable Berber family who will serve you the best dinner in the Gorges de Dades!

## Day 8

### A bit of off-road to the Valley of Roses and then to the Oasis of Skoura

This morning, you will do a bit of off-road driving, with the opportunity of seeing nomads, camels and other wildlife en route. This drive will take you through the Valley of Roses where during April and May each year, you will pass hundreds of rose-lined plots

of land. Over three thousand tonnes of rose petals are harvested here each Spring.

You will then drive on to a tiny village outside Skoura and experience traditional Berber hospitality with lunch prepared by a local Berber family, enjoyed in the cool shade of the oasis.

This evening your accommodation will be a lovely bou-tique hotel designed and owned by friendly local family.
